Brad Kahlhamer's art mixes the traditions of Native American art with expressionist painting, drawing inspiration from country western music and Native American rock scenes. His exhibition, *Let's Walk West*, recently appeared at the Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art in Arizona. For this issue he painted the gorgeous Fort Gotham story found on p. 124. Husband and wife team Jerome and Sydney Albertini respectively shot and painted *Mixed Media* for this Arts issue. Like their creative collaborations, a mix of French *je ne sais quoi* and American will, these two enjoy themselves to the fullest, and more often than not, do whatever they possibly can to keep it a constant party.

E.V. Day received her MFA from Yale University in 1995. Her installations, called "Exploding Couture," in which she suspends blown up women's dresses in space, began in 1999. Her piece, "Bombshell," was included in the 2000 Whitney Biennial, and she also had a solo exhibition at the Whitney Museum at Altria in 2001, where she installed "G-Force," in which hundreds of thongs were suspended from the ceiling in fighter jet formations.
